## PASCACK VALLEY ~ PROFILE 2017 - 2018

**COMMUNITIES:** Pascack Valley High School is one of two high schools in the Pascack Valley Regional High School District. Pascack Valley High School serves the northern Bergen County communities of Hillside and River Vale, New Jersey. The towns are neighboring suburban communities with a combined population of approximately 20,000. The location, 20 miles northwest of New York City, enables residents to take advantage of the many cultural and educational resources of a large city. Residents enjoy a middle to upper-middle class socio-economic level with the majority of adults employed as professionals and business executives. A high percentage of adults in both communities are college graduates. The community has high expectations and aspirations for its schools.

**SCHOOL:** Pascack Valley High School is a four-year college preparatory school with an enrollment of approximately 1300 students. The 2017 graduating class was comprised of 292 students. The school is a member of the National Association of College Admission Counselors and supports the Association's statement of "Principles of Good Practice." Pascack Valley High School consistently ranks in the top tier of New Jersey high schools as rated by the New Jersey Monthly Magazine.

**e-LEARNING:** The Pascack Valley Regional High School District is the first district in New Jersey to provide wireless laptops to all students and teachers to be used in classrooms and at home. This initiative, currently in the 13th year, impacts teaching, learning and communications between school and home while creating a community of learners between teachers and students. Advanced technological skills better prepare our students to enter college and the work place.

**PASCACK SCHEDULE:** Beginning with the 2014-15 school year, Pascack Valley High School has a new schedule that includes "Pascack Period". The Pascack Period is designed to provide an innovative learning environment, where all the students will have the choice to actively explore their personal passions for the betterment of themselves and their community. This schedule includes rotating periods, opportunities for longer periods, a common lunch, and time for non-traditional learning experiences.
